Summary of the Main Research Works

“Why and how differentiate Developing countries within the WTO? Lessons from Theory and Solutions for Negotiations”, with Jean-Marie-Paugam

With the Hong-Kong Ministerial Conference (December 2005), the Doha Negotiations seem to be on a standby because of several issues for which compromises tend to be difficult. Among them, Special and Differential Treatment (SDT) of Developing Countries. Developed Countries ask for more differentiation of DCs within the WTO, while DCs are opposed to any reform of this kind (DCs' status is based on a self-declaration at the WTO – which explains why Ghana and Singapore, for instance, belong to the same category and benefit from the same advantages). In practice however, the WTO already uses differentiation, and academics suggest several solutions to modify the system. What are the juridical, economic and political way to differentiate countries within the WTO? How to implement such a reform? Is it a possible option and/or even implementable?

Review of the various works that have been done on the links between terrorism and economy – Introduction to the thesis.

Definition and Transnational Terrorism Evolution Issues.

Any valuable study on this topic needs to be built on a solid and coherent definition of “transnational terrorism” and “significant incident”. Definitions vary with databases (for instance, the ITERATE database is large and flexible enough for its users to define the notion as they want). This stage is fundamental as it determines the rest of the thesis results obtained afterwards. It is also a good way to test the methodology and the results obtained by authors who have studied the subject. As underlined by Enders and Sandler in several of their articles, terrorism has changed, attacks are less numerous but they are more damaging in terms of human life and material destruction. The way in which international trade is modified and the way governments and economic agents react still have to be deduced.

This article will thus resume and give an outlook of what has been done until now by academics on transnational terrorism evolution and its characteristics.

Research Paper on Correlations between Freedom of the Press, Liberty, Civil Rights, Human Security and Development – UNESCO, Center for Peace and Human Security and GEM Joint Research Project

The purpose of this research is to collect and reorganize in a paper some quantitative and qualitative evidences of the correlations between indicators of an environment that is favorable to free and independent media and indicators of human development, human security, poverty reduction, good governance and peace. Developed with a team of 5 post graduated students, the intent of this research is to create a database of indicators related to freedom of the press, and to create a tool to be used by professionals involved in providing advisory services media legislation and raising awareness about freedom of the press with governments, parliamentarians, other decision makers as well as the civil society about the importance of the freedom of the press.
